

Second Notice of Demand to Texas Government Workers to Cease and Desist ERIC Contract

Notice to Principal is Notice to Agent and Notice to Agent is Notice to Principal

I, one of the people of the fifty American states (republican in form) Sui Juris, do serve this notice, that you and your agents may provide immediate due care:

Please take notice, all political power is inherent in the people and free governments are founded on the People's authority. All power is derived directly from the People, therefore the derivative power of government cannot be greater in power or authority than the ones from whom the power is derived. (See evidence below.)

Texas Constitution Article 1 Section 2:

All political power is inherent in the people, and all free governments are founded on their authority, and instituted for their benefit. The faith of the people of Texas stands pledged to the preservation of a republican form of government, and, subject to this limitation only, **they have at all times the inalienable right to alter, reform or abolish their government in such a manner as they may think expedient.** [Emphasis Added]

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

51o. All political power is inherent in the people by decree of God, thus none can exist except it be derived from them. American Maxim.

11b. The derivative power cannot be greater than the original from which it is derived. Noy, Max.; Wing. Max. 66; Finch, Law, b. 1, c. 3.

Please take notice that all Texas elected and appointed government officers have sworn an oath to uphold the Texas and U.S. Constitution which are trust indentures, thereby making you a Trustee bound by law to execute the duties of office according to the will of the People. The main objective of government is to preserve, protect and defend the personal rights and property as outlined in the Texas and U.S. Constitution. (See evidence below.)

Texas Constitution Article 16 Section 1(a):

All elected and appointed officers, before they enter upon the duties of their offices, shall take the following Oath or Affirmation:

"I, [name], do solemnly swear (or affirm), that I will faithfully execute the duties of the office of [title] of the State of Texas, and will **to the best of my ability preserve, protect, and defend the constitution and laws of the United States and of this State**, so help me God." [Emphasis Added]

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

51p. The main objective of government is the protection and preservation of **personal rights, private property**, public liberties, and upholding the laws of God. American Maxim [Emphasis Added]

Please take notice that in 2019 the Texas Legislature contracted for election data services with Electronic Record Information Center (ERIC), a non-elected, non-governmental organization with no trustee relationship to the People. The contract with ERIC binds Texas government entities to transfer the People's private data: voter registration data, motor vehicle licensing data, and Social Security data, etc. into the control of ERIC for comparison with other state's data. Where in your trust indenture did we grant you the authority to share our Personal Identifiable Information with a company that subjects it to proprietary activities? Where in your trust indenture did we grant you the authority to share our Personal Identifiable Information with non-government agents? Said contract is a violation of the people's common rights and constitutionally protected privacy.

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

11f. Power can never be delegated which the authority said to delegate never possessed itself. NJ. Steam Co. v. Merch Bank, 6 How. (47 U.S.) 344, 407.

86b. No man can forfeit another's right. *Fleta*, lib. 1, c. 28, s. 11.

86g. There is no doubt that the rights of others [third parties] cannot be prejudiced by private agreements. *Dig. 2, 15,3, pr.;* Broom, *Max.697*.

Texas Constitution Article 1 Section 19:

No citizen of this State shall be deprived of life, **liberty, property**, privileges or immunities, or in any manner disfranchised, except by the due course of the law of the land. [Emphasis Added]

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

62b. A repugnant act cannot be brought into being, i.e., cannot be made effectual. *Plowd.* 355.

46d. Where the law prescribes a form, the nonobservance of it is fatal to the proceeding, and the whole becomes a nullity. *Best, Ev.* Introd. s. 59.

Please take notice that such an act of attempting to delegate the legislature's power with regard to elections to non-elected, non-governmental entities, and doing so by invading the people's right to privacy is maladministration and a breach of trust. Any wrongful misappropriation by a trustee of any fund or property which has been lawfully committed to him in a fiduciary character or any act done by a trustee contrary to the terms of his trust or in excess of his authority and to the detriment of the trust is in violation of duty and a breach of trust. (Black's law 4th)

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

34h. A neglected duty often works as much against the interests as a duty wrongfully performed. *Keim. v U.S.*, 177 U.S. 290, 295

Please take notice that the people, who have all power & authority, have previously given notice regarding ERIC which has yet been answered by either rebuttal or with affirmative action. Ignoring the first notice is acting in maladministration as you and your agents are beholden to follow the will of the people to the exclusion of any other party.

Maxims of Law by Charles A. Weisman

51b. The government is to be subject to the law, for the law makes the government. C.L.M.

51c. Obedience makes government, not the name by which it is called. C.L.M.

51r. An usurpation is the exercise of power, which another has a right to; so tyranny is the exercise of power beyond the right, which no body can have a right to. *Locke, Treat.* 2, 18, 199.

By the power of one of the people, and the power declared in the above constitutional provisions, it is my wish, order, and demand that you:

1. Immediately cease and desist working with ERIC or any other non-governmental third party with elections and make a public announcement regarding the withdrawal from this contract.
2. Cleanse the voter rolls and register valid voters within the legally authorized scope of legislature.
3. Openly and publicly communicate with all People of Texas on how their constitutional rights to liberty and security are being restored.

By continuing to ignore the will of the people by using the ERIC system and to defer to other private entities, such as the Bar Association to go against the Peoples' common rights to life, liberty, and property, you will be committing a trespass against the people and, as a result, would be dissolving yourselves.

If you believe the above stated to be untrue, please provide the constitutional evidence in the form of an affidavit sworn under penalty of perjury within 5 days. Please also show us where in your trust indenture, the Texas Constitution, that we, the People, said you can delegate your responsibilities to another. Failure to respond, by affidavit, in the allotted time frame means that you are agreeing that you are interfering with the Peoples' right to conduct lawful elections and that you agree you are harming the People with full intent, knowledge and malice. Furthermore, you agree by acquiescence, that all statements in this notice to be true and fact and that no court shall rehear this matter, but it shall stand as truth in all courts of record.

This notice is sent to you in peace and in the love of Christ, so that you may provide due care to those who have all political power, the People.
